A Message from Bishop Stephen to the Archdiocese of Birmingham

I ask for your prayers as it is announced that Pope Francis has appointed me Bishop of Hexham and Newcastle Diocese. The news came as a shock to me. My new Diocese has had a very painful recent history so please keep the people and clergy in your prayers. I trust in God's grace and although sad to leave my home Archdiocese, I look forward to unknown joys ahead in the North- East.

I am very sorry to clergy and teachers who in recent days may have felt I was being absent in post. I could not explain why. It has been very challenging juggling commitments and talking about a pastoral future I will not now share with you.

I will be moving to live in Newcastle upon Tyne in early July with my Installation Mass set for Wednesday 19 July. Invitations and details will follow. I will do my best to honour liturgical commitments until 2 July here in the Archdiocese. From that date onwards I am sorry I will not be available.

An enormous prayerful thank you to you all.

"He will be greatly missed by his brother priests and by the communities that he has served across the Episcopal Area of Staffordshire, the Black Country and Wolverhampton.
